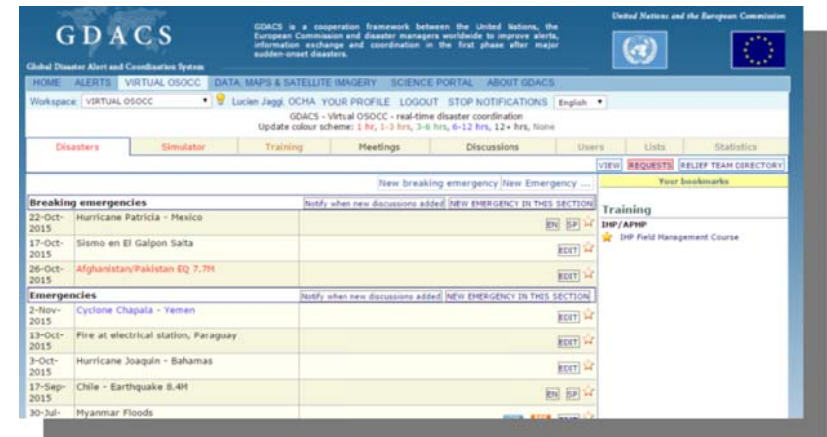

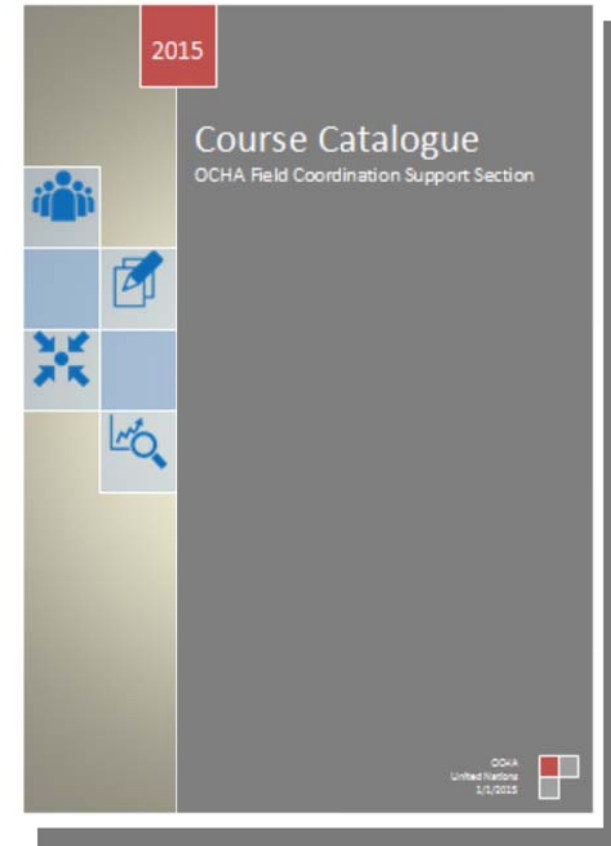

Emergency Response Course

- Subjects

1. Explain the operating modality in the context of wider humanitarian field coordination, including cluster coordination.
2. Utilize confidently information management tools to boost enhanced information flow within and between disaster response networks
3. Apply influential communication skills to foster collaborative preparedness and response planning and programming
4. Design and maintain coherent on-site coordination platforms for information sharing and interactions in emergencies.
5. Optimize the use of collaborative working tools for preparedness and response effectiveness.

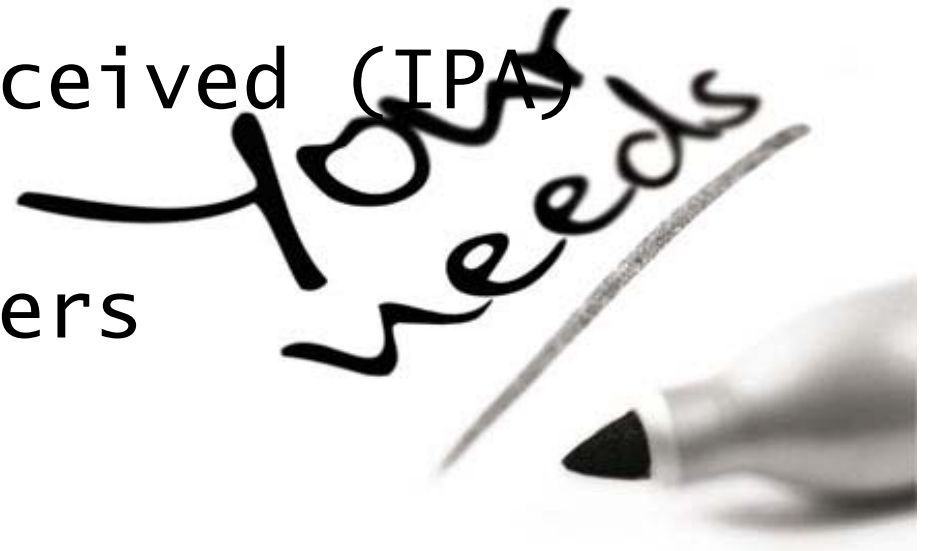
