EU guiding principles for external cooperation

- "Team Europe approach" (EU27+European Institutions)
- Speak with one voice, at global, regional and country level
 => EU coherence, unity, solidarity and coordination
- Focus on a strategic engagement and funding
 - Balkans & Turkey = EU geopolitical priority
- Build robust Win-Win-(Win) partnerships, political dialogues
- Promote EU values, multilateralism, HR & rule of law, UNSDGs
- For Civil protection = Sendai framework, SDGs, Green Deal
- Balkans: Berlin Process



External cooperation on Civil Protection Mid & long term regional Capacity Building

- 1. close consultation
 - with other EU services, EU delegations and Member States embassies (Team Europe)
 - With UCPM Participating States (EU27 + Iceland , Norway, SER, MNE, NM, TK)
 - with third countries
- 2. Enhance participation of existing field technical expertise and networks
 - at national, sub-regional, regional level
- 3. Coordination and/or joint programming with regional players
 - Union for the Mediterranean, EU CBRN Centres of Excellence, DPPI, NATO, League of Arab States, UNDRR (Europe/ Arab States), GCC, US



External cooperation on Civil Protection

Priority threats and risks

- Forest fires
- Floods
- Earthquakes
- Health Emergencies (Covid-like)
- Marine Pollution
- Other: hybrid, electric black out, critical infrastructures



External cooperation on Civil Protection

Participating and/or implementing partners

- National Civil Protection authorities from the EU, Enlargement, Southern and Eastern Neighbourhood
- Regional and national champions (existing structures/ expertise)
- Regional and international organisations: DPPI, League of Arab States, UNDRR (Europe/ Arab States), NATO, International Science Centres (STCU/ISTC)



Future challenges and perspectives

- Define a coherent UCPM international strategy
 - Balkans and Turkey
 - Mediterranean (North Africa Sahel and Middle East)
 - Eastern Europe (Eastern partnership: BY, UK, ML, GE, AR, AZ)
- Revise Participation Agreement(s) to UCPM, including criteria and receipting
- Expand UCPM to new members
- Consolidate UCPM working links with all EU services, EU delegations, UCPM States embassies in the neighbourhood
- Promote a Team Europe cooperation approach on the ground
- Pursue bilateral, regional and International to major stakeholders

- Focus on earthquakes and health emergencies
- Cross-sectorial, cross-border, demand driven
- Deployment of on-site technical expertise + reserve pool of specific experts
- Sealing into the new EU/UCPM toolbox (RescEU, Knowledge network, trainings, exercices incl. MODEX, TAIEX, advisory missions, peer reviews, risk mapping)
- Reinforce support to regional and subregional champions, predeployed capabilities? Pool of regional experts?
- Broad bilateral and regional consultation started



Mediterranean area

Future Prevention, Preparedness and Response regional programme 2022-2024/25:"*PPRD Mediterranean*"

- Under the umbrella of the Union for the Mediterranean policy dialogue
- Cross-sectorial, cross-border, demand driven (bilat/regional consultations started)
- Based on lessons learned (PPRD3 + other projects), UfM WGs on volunteers and engaging citizens and identified risks and priorities
- Deployment of on-site technical expertise + reserve pool of specific experts
- Sealing into the new EU/UCPM toolbox (RescEU, Knowledge network, trainings, exercices incl. MODEX, TAIEX, advisory missions, peer reviews, risk mapping)
- Reinforce support to regional and subregional champions, predeployed capabilities?


The main features of the regulation – <u>prevention and</u> <u>preparedness</u> phase

- → non-binding & via COM recommendations
- → limited to the area of civil protection

Disaster Loss Data






Disaster Scenario Planning

rescEU- Recap

• Primarily deployed within the EU (MS/PS)!



- Deployment internationally is possible "if a disaster outside the Union could significantly affect one or more Member States or their citizens".
- rescEU priority areas:





The main features of the regulation - Direct procurement

Before

→ only MS/PS can procure and host rescEU capacities



Now

also the Commission can (directly) procure rescEU capacities, under <u>specific conditions</u>

Transport and logistics capacities

- 1. always possible (also in 'peace time')
- 2. rent, lease or contract, NO acquisition (and no ownership)
- 3. Implementing Act needed

(any other) rescEU capacity, existing or new

- 1. only in duly justified cases of emergency
- 2. only items or assets, NO modules!
- 3. Urgent Implementing Act needed
- 4. in force for 6 months, CPC to confirm or reject




